

## ACCEPTANCE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE DISCOVERY REFORM GRANT & BUDGET MODIFICATION - DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

WHEREAS, on January 1, 2020, the State of New York enacted sweeping Discovery and Bail Reform legislation that require District Attorney's Offices to obtain and turn over to defense, all evidence in any criminal case, regardless of the level of crime, within a very short period of time and eliminate bail for many offenses, and

WHEREAS, this legislation requires the District Attorney's Office collect all items and information in its possession, including all information in the possession of any law enforcement agency, including reports, supplemental reports and investigative notes, 911 calls, radio transmissions, booking or surveillance video, photographs, body camera footage, witness and co-defendant statements, and the names of all law enforcement personnel and witnesses involved, for submittal to the defense within 15 days of arraignment for approximately 5,000 cases yearly, and

WHEREAS, these discovery requirements significantly increase the burden on law enforcement agencies by requiring them to separate out, create a record of, and share every 911 call, radio transmission, booking or surveillance video and body cam footage for each arrest or appearance ticket issued within fifteen days of arraignment, and

WHEREAS, this legislation also eliminated bail for many criminal offenses and created increased pre-trial supervision requirements, greatly reducing the number of people held in jail and increasing the responsibilities of Probation Departments, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services has recognized the extreme burden placed on District Attorney's Offices, Sheriff's Offices, Probation Departments and local law enforcement agencies outside of New York City as a result of these changes, and

WHEREAS, funding in the amount of \$40,000,000 has been set aside by the State of New York to support expenses related to the implementation of discovery and bail reforms that took effect January 1, 2020, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County has been awarded \$938,153 of these funds based on its proportionate share of criminal court arraignments statewide, to be distributed among and utilized by County agencies, and

WHEREAS, funding will be provided to the following agencies that submitted requests to the District Attorney's Office, and whose requests were approved in full or in part, by the Division of Criminal Justice Services, and

WHEREAS, the District Attorney has determined the need for additional staffing to address the significant increase in the workload resulting from the criminal justice mandates which should be addressed through the use of this funding, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Probation Department has identified critical public safety needs that include additional GPS monitoring equipment and related expenses which should be addressed with these funds, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Sheriff's Office has identified critical training needs for law enforcement personnel which should be addressed with these funds, and

WHEREAS, the funds would be used to purchase a Use of Force Simulator which would benefit the entire county, as well as be used toward a training facility to be built on property currently owned by Niagara County in conjunction with grant funding, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County of Niagara does hereby accept this award, and be it further

RESOLVED, that prior to the execution of the grant award contract, the County Attorney will review the grant award contract for approval as to legal form, language and compliance, and be it further

RESOLVED, that following the County Attorney's review, the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature be, and is hereby authorized to execute the grant award documents, and be it further

RESOLVED, that effective May 10, 2021, one (1) permanent full time Assistant District Attorney position, Job Group ATT, District Attorney Level II, Step 1, \$69,258 annually, be created and filled, and be it further

RESOLVED, that effective May 10, 2021, one (1) permanent full time Assistant District Attorney position, Job Group ATT, District Attorney Level III, Step 1, \$80,802 annually, be created and filled, and be it further

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

## ACCEPTANCE OF GUN INVOLVED VIOLENCE ELIMINATION INITIATIVE GRANT

WHEREAS, in 2014 the Division of Criminal Justice Services initiated a gun violence eradication initiative to target the rising incidents of gun involved violence across the State of New York and specifically the seventeen counties that account for the vast majority of crime outside of the City of New York which includes the County of Niagara, and

WHEREAS, the GIVE (Gun Involved Violence Elimination) Initiative is a statewide comprehensive strategy that focuses exclusively on reducing shootings and homicides by promoting integrated, evidence based strategies, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County District Attorney's Office, the Niagara County Sheriff's Office and the Niagara County Probation Department, in conjunction with the Niagara Falls Police Department, applied for the renewal of funding under the 2021-2022 GIVE Initiative, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County District Attorney's Office and the Niagara County Probation Department have received notification that funding has been awarded in the amounts of \$167,405 and \$66,720 respectively, for the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, with no required match from Niagara County, and

WHEREAS, the District Attorney's Office has an Assistant District Attorney position #4771, which is currently funded under this program and will remain coterminous with grant funding, and

WHEREAS, revenue and appropriation figures for said program were calculated and are contained within the District Attorney's Office and Probation Department budgets for fiscal year 2021, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County of Niagara does hereby accept this award, and be it further

RESOLVED, that prior to the execution of the grant award contract, the County Attorney will review the grant award contract for approval as to legal form, language and compliance, and be it further

RESOLVED, that following the County Attorney's review, the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature be, and is hereby authorized to execute the grant award documents.



**ADOPTION OF A LOCAL LAW TO ADOPT CERTAIN BENEFITS UNDER § 458-b OF THE  
REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK AUTHORIZING  
AN ALTERNATIVE TAX EXEMPTION FOR COLD WAR VETERANS  
BE CHANGED FROM 10% OPTION TO 15% OPTION**

WHEREAS, Legislator David E. Godfrey, et al. recommend the adoption of the following Local Law:

A Local Law To Adopt Certain Benefits Under § 458-B of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York Authorizing an Alternative Tax Exemption for Cold War Veterans be Changed From 10% Option to 15% Option; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on May 4, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. in the Legislative Chambers, Courthouse, Lockport, New York, on said Local Law, and

WHEREAS, no one appeared to speak on said Local Law, and

WHEREAS, no amendments(s) was (were) made to said Local Law, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a Local Law to adopt certain benefits under § 458-b of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York authorizing an alternative tax exemption for Cold War Veterans,

Be it enacted by the County Legislature of the County of Niagara as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to subsection 2(a) of § 458-b of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York, the County of Niagara hereby adopts the qualifying residential real property exemption under subsection 2(a)(ii) of § 458-b of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York, that is, an exemption in the amount of fifteen percent of the assessed value of such property, provided however, that such exemption, as permitted by subsection 2(c)(iii), shall not exceed \$15,000 or the product of \$15,000 multiplied by the latest state equalization rate of such property's assessing unit, such exemption to be subject to the definitions, limitations and requirements of § 458-b.

Section 2. Pursuant to subsection 2(b) of § 458-b of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York, the County of Niagara hereby adopts the qualifying residential real property exemption under subsection 2(b) of § 458-b of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York, that is, an exemption in the amount equal to the extent of the product of the assessed value of such property, multiplied by fifty percent of the Cold War veteran disability rating; provided, however, that such exemption, as permitted by subsection 2(c)(iii) shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars or the product of fifty thousand dollars multiplied by the latest state equalization rate for the assessing unit.

Section 3. This Local Law shall take immediately upon its filing with the Secretary of State and shall be applicable to all assessment rolls prepared pursuant to the first taxable status date occurring on or after the effective date of this local law.
