Program to investigate sewers tributary to CSO's 6 and 8 which will fund a maximum of 80% of the proposed Planning Study costs up to \$30,000, and

Whereas, NYSEFC requires that the City submit an executed engineering agreement in order to enter into a Grant Agreement between NYSEFC and the City; and

Whereas, the City's engineering consultant Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc. assisted the City with preparation of the grant application and submitted a proposal dated June 3, 2021 to provide engineering services related to the CSO 6 and 8 tributary area evaluation; and

Whereas, TECsmith, Inc. submitted a proposal to the City dated June 2, 2021 for flow monitoring services required for the CSO 6 and 8 tributary area evaluation and has successfully competed similar work for the City on previous such studies; now, therefore, be it

Whereas, the administration has compiled a recommendation for the use of these funds in the form of a FY 2021 Supplemental Budget #2, which proposes that said funds be appropriated for three distinct purposes - (1) restoration of the general fund contingency budget (2) reduction in the budgeted amount of general fund balance appropriation, and (3) as an interfund transfer to capital for the purchase of a bucket truck for public works; now, therefore, be it
